order and of import is the interim protective order as amended by an order entered today and an order regarding the option for service under specific circumstances. Let me talk about that order for a moment.

That order resulted from the Court suggesting, requesting otherwise attempting to impose its position upon defense counsel to accept service. As we all know there is absolutely no authority for me to impose an alternate service method upon defendants absent certain circumstances as contained in the rules which are not evident in this particular case.

have an interim protective order in place, the insurance coverage information and declaration sheet will be produced by August 16th. ESI witnesses are going to be deposed by August 23rd.
